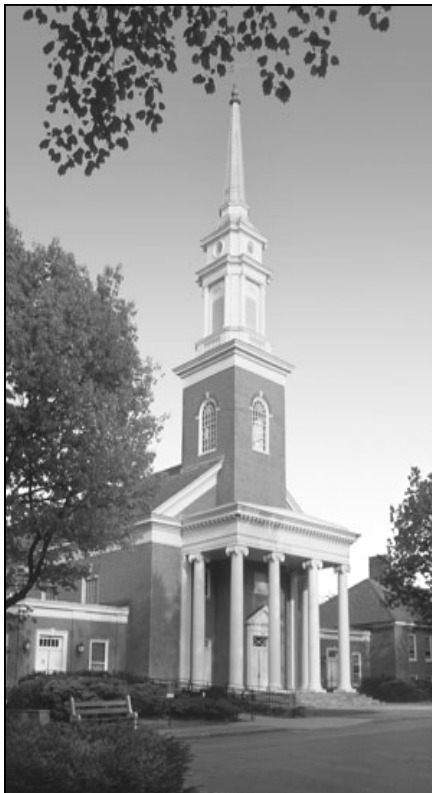

**EASTERN STATE PENITENTIARY TOUR  
AND HISTORIC CITY TAVERN**  
*FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2012 — \$55 per person*

Experience what life was like behind the walls for the more than 75,000 men and women who once served time in Philadelphia’s historic, 142-year-old Eastern State Penitentiary. It was the world’s first true *penitentiary*, designed to inspire penitence, with the seven cellblocks spread like the spokes of a wheel, each containing vaulted, sky lit cells. The prison boasted running water and central heat, even before the White House, and housed many of America’s most notorious criminals, including bank robber “Slick Willie” Sutton and “Scarface” Al Capone.

On a privately guided tour you will learn about the revolutionary architecture, the famous inmates and some daring attempted prison escapes. Some areas of the prison are exposed to the elements, although all attempts will be made to minimize exposure. The 1:30 p.m. tour will last one hour. We will have additional time at the conclusion of the tour to roam the site.

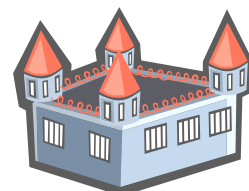
Prior to our prison tour we will dine at the historic City Tavern on 2nd Street in Philadelphia. The tavern is an accurate reconstruction of the 1773 building and therefore has no elevators, but does have street-level accessibility to the wine cellar dining rooms.

**SOME HISTORY:** When John Adams arrived in Philadelphia in August of 1774 to attend the First Continental Congress, he was greeted by leading citizens and immediately taken to the tavern he would call “the most genteel tavern in America.” The tavern Adams referred to, City Tavern, was not yet a year old and was already caught up in momentous events. A few months earlier, Paul Revere had ridden up to the tavern with the news of the closing of the Port of Boston by the British government. Now, some of the most influential in the colonies gathered in Philadelphia to decide a common response to this and other “intolerable acts.” For the next decade, City Tavern would be a familiar sight to the leading figures of the American Revolution.

Our 11:30 a.m. reservation for the Liberty Lunch includes a Lancaster field greens salad, colonial turkey pot pie and fresh fruit cobbler with freshly baked breads and hot tea and coffee.

Board the bus at 9:00 a.m. from the FPC rear parking lot.
