An order for *Compline*, a late evening service

Holy Saturday, March 30, 2024 8:00 PM

The ancient office of Compline derives its name from the Latin word completorium, meaning 'completion'. It is above all a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day. The service is most effective when its ending is indeed an ending, without additions, conversation or noise. If there are announcements or business to be done, it should come first. If the service is in church, after a final song or anthem those present depart in silence; if at home, they go quietly to bed.
